Emergency shelters of appleton, Inc. has provided temporary lodging to the homeless of he Fox Valley since 1981. The Emergency Shelter is available to anyone who needs temporary housing at night. Through a referral network, people are screened to determine whether services are needed. All guests are given information on available community resources which may help them to find permanent housing, food and clothing.

During this past year, generous contributions of time and materials permitted us to paint the house, to replace the carpet in the men's area, to install new blinds on the porch and begin establishing a small office in the shelter for records storage.

Work still to be initiated, however, includes insulating the pipes, acquiring and installing a new air conditioner and painting the windows. So the community support continues to be ever essential in serving the homeless with dignity.

We are in great need of retired people, homemakers or shift workers who can volunteer mornings between 8:00 am and 1:30 pm. to:

- clean gutters
- repair hole in garage roof
- someone with an edger and/or hedge trimmer to come once a month in summer (or donate these items)
- building shelves in garage or storage
- someone to install kitchen cupboard (if we get some)
- someone with truck to pick up free dirt to fill in back yard
- painting windows, inside and out. replace cracked ones
- repair a couple of combination windows

Often when our guests get a job and then an apartment, they have nothing to set up housekeeping. We have a few donations that we can give them to get started. We are always in need of beds, tables, chairs, dishes and other essentials to give them. But first we need shelves built in our garage to put items on. We have doors that can be used, but we have no 2x4's to build with.

Items needed (used)

- A few basic household tools..hammers, pliers, screwdrivers
- disposable razors
- alarm clocks
- used curling irons and hair dryers
- tv stands
- kitchen waste baskets
- used washers and dryers
- used kitchen cupboards
- small night stands
- carpet 5'2"x 13'
- outdoor paint for garage

- water repellent stain for outdoor use
- air conditioner
- day beds
- bunk beds
- terry cloth or other non-iron table clothes
- lots of laundry soap and garbage bags
- used garden tools, spade, garden rakes, garden hose
- used 2x4's for shelves
- christmas and holiday decorations
- a few interior house plants
- light bulbs, toilet cleaning supplies
- caulking for windows

We get all or food donated through St. Joseph's Food Pantry but we are always short supply of basics--flour, oil, rice, noodles, shorting, margarine, sugar, catsup, mustard, coffee and a few basic spices. We seldom get meat. No powdered milk or spaghetti please.

Perhaps you have had to clean out a parent's home after a death and wondering what to do with all those small household and personal items. A number of people have donated them to Emergency Shelters and perhaps you could consider doing the same.

Also maybe several of you might consider joining forces and "adopting" a project that needs doing on an on-going basis or just a one time project. Or perhaps several of you might like to keep our kitchen cupboards supplied with basic cooking supplies. Or perhaps a group of you might be interested in doing a one-time house cleaning/window washing project. We would be most grateful for whatever you might care to do for us.

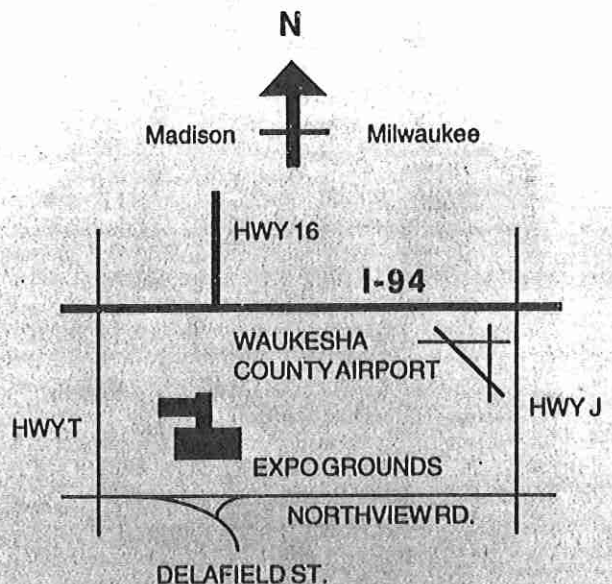
