First of this month is a special welcome to the new members of the FCARC. Five new members in one month must set some kind of record. I hope you found the meeting interesting and met some new friends. We look forward to seeing you monthly and hope the club provides the enjoyment and opportunity that you seek. We have many activities going on and hope you will become involved in areas that are interesting to you. Feel free to ask questions and be sure to check with those individuals on the inventory sheet passed out at the last club meeting. Again welcome.

Since I will be in Denver the third Monday in July and will miss the club meeting, I would like to report on the budget review committee meeting. I had promised to make a report at the July meeting but since I cannot yell loudly enough to be heard from Denver I would like to summarize here. Special thanks to Dan Bayer, Dave Bolen, Bill Niemuth and Steve Schmeichel for helping to evaluate the budget and come up with suggestions for the board to consider.

Our two main sources of income, as you may know, are dues and the hamfest. It may come as a surprise to some to note that our dues provide less than half our operating budget. Nearly all of the balance comes from the proceeds of the hamfest. If we have a successful hamfest, we cover the balance of our budget and have funds available for other activities. If for some reason the hamfest was a flop, you can see we would have some serious problems. I hope this year many more of you will become involved in making this "survival activity" a success. At any rate, the Budget Review Committee decided that we have about one thousand dollars beyond our budget needs. Based on these calculations and further ideas from the Board of Directors, the following was approved.

1.	Promotional activities of amateur radio and the FCARC.	\$200.00
2.	Two (2) one hundred dollar scholarships. The details are to be worked out by a committee.	\$200.00
3.	Support of the number of local area repeaters. The details will be worked out by the Board of Directors.	\$500.00
4.	Club library updates and improvements.	\$100.00

		\$1000.00

The total of one thousand dollars is the amount beyond our needs. It is believed this money should be used to help further amateur radio in our area. As you may or may not know the FCARC does not own or maintain any repeater. Membership in the FCARC does not automatically make you a member of any repeater association. The club's donation to area

repeaters is only a token gesture in helping local area repeater associations financially and probably in a small way. The club's donation does not relieve any club member from the responsibility of supporting a repeater association by paying their own dues. All hams who use repeaters are expected to join at least one repeater association. Many hams support more than one repeater. When you consider the privileges you have in the use of any repeater, the small membership fee is a real bargain. In fact, it is a bargain at twice the cost!!

Is the sweet corn ready yet? Nope you say? Well that's good because we aren't planning it until the end of August. I hope we can find some corn then. We plan to have it in an Appleton Park this year and hope to have events that will involve all family members. We plan to have some games for the kids who attend, some sort of radio activity, lots of food and fun for all. Stay tuned in for details.

Clubs and most organizations, for that matter, have members who go that extra mile when it comes to involvement, work and effort. The FCARC is no exception. This month I would like to highlight two of our members. In a significant way they are responsible for member involvement in serving our community and the enhancement of amateur radio. These two men are Bob Cleveland (WD9HID) and Larry Seibers (KD9IA).

Bob is the vice-president and along with that job comes the responsibility of organizing the communicators for various civic events. Bob, I am sure, will have a report as to the number of events and a listing of fellow hams involved, but the extra work and background coordination often goes unnoticed. CORN ROAST:

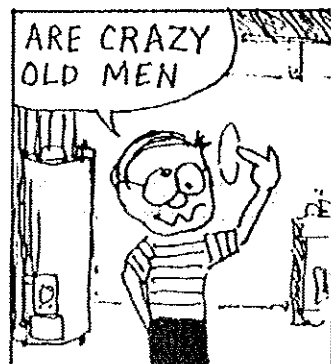
The Fox Cities Amateur Radio Club will have a corn roast in August. There will be events for young and old. More details will be available at the next club meeting.

FOX HUNT RULES

1. You must remain within 100 feet from a marked road.
2. You must remain on public property. (Access to everyone)
3. You must remain in the boundaries set on the map.
4. You must be heard by at least one hunter at the start of the hunt.
5. You must transmit at least once per minute. (Usually a QSO with the hunters is done.)
6. The fox provides soda and a treat to the hunters when the fox is found.
7. All traffic laws must be observed during the hunt!
8. The fox must start transmitting at the set time of the beginning of the hunt.
9. The fox should log all those hunters who are participating and the time of their arrival.
10. The first hunter to find the transmitter, (not the fox) will be the fox at the next month's hunt.

FOX HUNT

The Fox Cities Amateur Radio Club Fox Hunt started out wondering whether we would be drowned out. The weather had been bad during the afternoon hours. Larry (KD9IA) announced after the A.R.E.S. net that the hunt would still go on.

Boy, what a good turn out. Well, the fox spotted ND9Z and N9FZL driving across the top of the hill first. Gary and Cathy entered Doyle Park in Little Chute first and proceeded to drive around the park. Minutes later Gary and Cathy walked by me and said hello with their HT's and antennas off. Well, Doyle Park was getting ready for a carnival so there was a lot of equipment around and lots of travel trailers with antennas sticking up. Cathy noted you must know someone and have the transmitter set up in one of those travel trailers. After walking

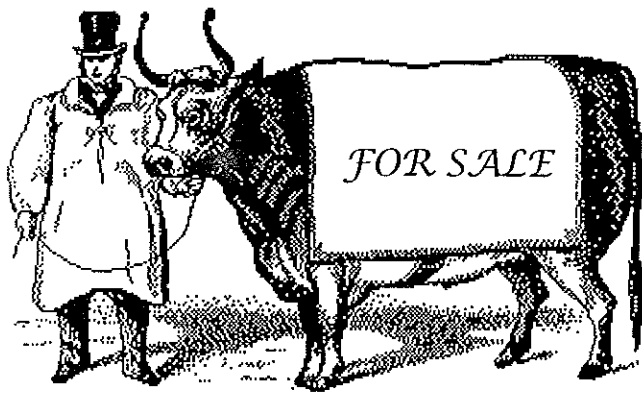

NOVICE EXAMS COME TO VEC SYSTEM

On May 14, 1993, the FCC announced that, effective July 1, 1993, all amateur radio license examinations must be VEC coordinated. This action is a result of the FCC's rule making proceeding initiated July 13, 1992, on the "Amendment of the Amateur Service Rules to include Novice class operator license examinations in the Volunteer-Examiner Coordinator Examination System," PR Docket No. 92-154.

The changes, which will take effect July 1, 1993, include:

- Three General (or higher) class licensed Volunteer Examiners will be able to administer Novice and Technician license examinations (Elements 1A, 2 AND 3A)
- In order to administer examinations, General class amateurs must be accredited, and may seek accreditation.
- General class club members who are interested in helping with the test sessions should call the ARRL. Ask for the volunteer exam manual and get certified. If you have any questions about it you can contact George (W9MDP) or Larry (KD9IA) for an explanation on how the VE program works. (From the "VE Express" ARRL newspaper)
- Effective July 1, 1993, the Novice question pool has been changed. The ARRL has a new study guide that will be out by this date.

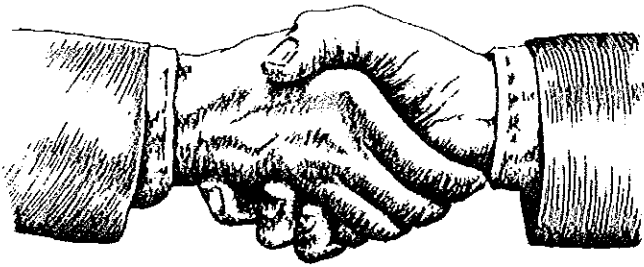

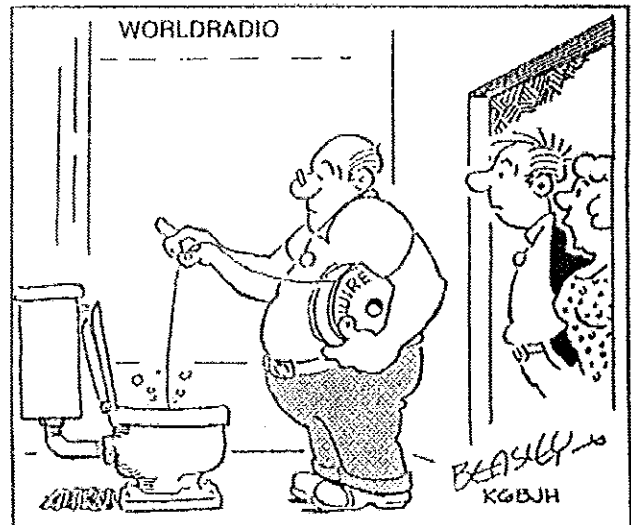
