Like a former TV evangelist would say at the beginning of his show "something good is going to happen." Now I may not be big on TV evangelism or TV for that matter, but that optimistic attitude goes a long way toward making something happen. Well that something or something good has been happening and continues to happen with the FCARC.

As each month goes by, new hams continue to appear at our door and join the ranks as fellow Fox Cities hams. Each month new and not so new hams come forward with new ideas and/or new enthusiasm about old ideas I could not be happier about this level of enthusiasm and involvement.

My old high school football coach said often, "the difference between being good and being great is that little bit of extra effort." Though we may not yet be great, we are beginning to see lots of extra effort and great or better is in sight.

To begin with, I would like to site a few examples of this new involvement and list two areas that need some development. An area of interest that has just recently been rejuvenated at the club level is Field Day and contesting. This area like many others, exists and thrives in proportion to leadership and involvement. We've had in the past, some excellent Field Day events with very good participation. More recently, our club has not sponsored a Field Day and some members have looked to neighboring clubs to fill this need. Also contesting has been done by individuals and not as an organized club function. This is fine of course, but it may be a club function as well. We have a group of FCARC hams who are going to develop this area and are encouraging a greater involvement from the club hams. Gerry Radtke and Gary Hoene are taking charge of this area. There will be a monthly report and an article in the newsletter. There is already a Field Day site reserved and field tested. Look forward to this exciting area and feel free to get involved in what I believe, will become a major function of the club.

A second area that is relatively new to many of us is QRP (low power). In the past, as far as I know, the FCARC has not had a spark plug group who organized and developed this area. Well QRP it seems, has seen a resurgence in the various magazine articles and in many of our members. Some interesting ideas have been presented recently and plans are in the works to develop a leadership group to encourage involvement among those interested hams. Bob Kallio, a relatively new but active and enthusiastic member will be developing some ideas to be presented to the membership in the future. It is a joy to see this area being developed. It is lots of fun to be involved.

A third area that is in its fifth year of development is the educational classes leading to the novice or technician class of license. From the beginning of my experience with the club, the instructors were mainly a small group, sometimes only one, with lots of work and a limited success rate. This year, with a new beginning and a new approach, we have grown in membership involvement. Now we have eleven members

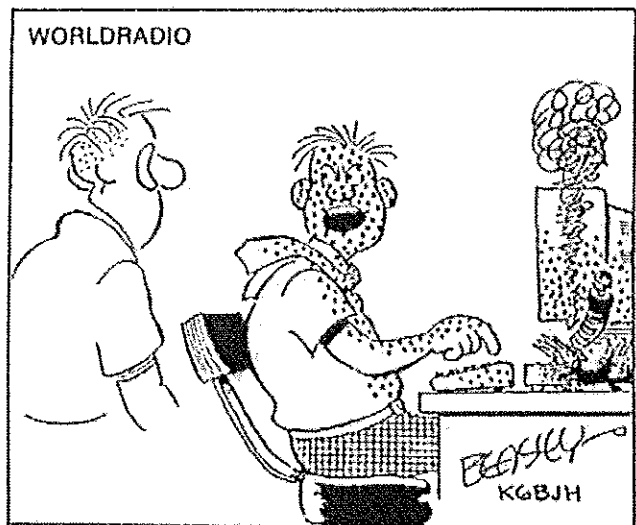
developing the program and expect to have at least eleven members involved in the tutoring and instructional phase of the class. Although our instructional philosophy has changed a bit, we look forward to a much improved success rate. If you know of someone who is interested in taking the class, they may contact me for a packet of information that should answer most questions.

Two areas that remain are the scholarship committee and the publicity committee. These committees do not require a large group or much work. I believe are important to the club. We expect that our membership will continue to grow and we expect that our scholarship fund will probably grow as our hamfest continues to grow. If you are interested in being a part of either of these committees, please let me know. If there is no response, some of you may expect a call from me with a little bit of pressure. I am anxious to get both areas off the ground in the next month. Thanks for your consideration.

This past month has been a real joy for me and I hope it has been for you also. We've had fox hunting, thanks Chad. We've provided communications for a walk-a-thon and a marathon, thanks Bob. We've had meetings with QRP leaders, Field Day/contest leaders and education leaders. Are we busy or what? The JOY is in seeing this level of activity and growth taking place in our club. I've heard many favorable comments regarding our vitality and a great big thanks goes out to the membership for making it happen. Remember YOU are the membership.

CONTEST FORUM:

**CQ Field Day! CQ Field Day!
This is W9ZL Field Day!**

Every June the airways are filled with amateurs using their club's call for Field Day. W9ZL would sound good on the air this Field Day.

To introduce ourselves, we are all FCARC members who formed a contest club a few years ago. Members are WA9GON (Gerry), KD9BC (John), N9AOT (Terry) KB9AIT (Gary). We are proposing that our group form a contest arm of the FCARC.

Is this something the FCARC feels is wanted or needed? If it is, each month contest information will be presented at our meeting and an article each month in the club newsletter. We will also keep the club updated on upcoming contests, contest results, awards, DX and related information.

We would like to organize and have as many FCARC members spend some time in the fun world of contesting. About every two months there is a contest we would like to participate in as a club.

In January, there is the ARRL RTTY ROUNDUP. The month of March is the very popular WISCONSIN QSO PARTY. Of course, in June, the ARRL FIELD DAY event. Next is November with ARRL SWEEPSTAKES, a contest that has many club entries. Other contests that may be included are CQWW (SSB & CW) and the VHF-UHF contests.

UNDER CONSTRUCTION

Mike, WB9BBI, showed one of his home brew projects. It was an event counter built from an old calculator. He attached two wires to a circuit board under the calculator's '=' key. The wires were then connected to a pressure sensor. The sensor was made by placing the finger of a rubber glove over the end of a hose. The wires were placed next to the glove finger. As the pressure in the hose increases the glove expands like a balloon pushing one wire in contact with the other. This simulates someone pressing the '=' sign on the calculator. All you have to do to program this event counter is press '1' '+' '1' and you got a counter. Each time the wires close the display increments by 1.
