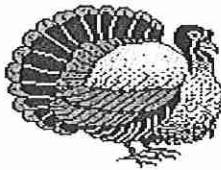

2001 "Construction" HAMFEST / SWAPMEET



By all measures everyone in the club should be pleased with how well the Hamfest turned out. Success can be attributed to the helpful participation from many club members in the planning and pre-fest activities such as mailings and email notices. Another thing that I think is required these days for a good Hamfest event is the willingness and ability to commit significant money to the event. That we did, and it separates our club from many others.

We did make a profit; the exact amount is still being figured out, and I think nearly everyone involved had a good time. Attendance looks as though it was up quite a bit and the tables we had sold out. We had to add a few. I had many reports from sellers that sales were good.

I will try to mention a few things here especially for those of you who could not make the event this year.

The Hamfest got a theme. It was the "2001 Construction Swapmeet" and we put up some large signs. The club table was really full with parts and we had a banner over it that I think said, "w9zl, we have parts, build something." We also hung a large American Flag behind the stage. With the construction materials around, the unfinished walls and ceiling and the blocked off areas with dirt piles and trenches in the floors, it all seemed to fit together and added some "unique atmosphere" to the event.

Some new things were done this year. The \$50 donation prize for the club with the most members to sign-in was really liked a lot. People stopped back at the registration table from time to time to see how things were going. It was a surprise that the Door County club won. Some Green Bay guys were predicting an easy win to me as they checked in while I was working the registration table. Oh well! There are enough fairly big clubs close by that this could get pretty interesting. No one I talked to had ever seen this done before, so perhaps we will have it exclusive for a while. Maybe we should raise the prize some next year and get some more competition going.

The registration form was modified several times during the year. The latest version that was being used, I think puts a professional touch on how things are handled for the event by our club. The Email confirmation was appreciated by many and a number of people opted to get away from the SASE ticket return because of that. It saves time and money for those pre-registering and for us in managing the event. It's on the web site if you did not see the latest one I am talking about. There will probably be more changes this year and suggestions are always helpful.

The newspaper ad definitely got noticed. It ran 4 times which gave us various degrees of coverage from Fond du Lac to GB and Manitowoc to Waupaca. That is what the paper people say. It was around 260,000 impressions. I think it did more good than we will be able to exactly measure. It will be more to talk about with potential commercial vendors for next year and it helps give us a more official presence in the communities around here. People did show up with the ad in hand to use as a coupon much to the surprise of the helpers at the registration table.

That was kind of funny, but Hal, Betty, Don and everyone who helped at registrations did a great job. With the coupon, club sign-in sheets and the prices that came out with .50 cents, there was a little more work at the table than usual.

I was getting complaints about massive radio problems right away. Unfortunately, Greg was not handy for probably the one great interference problem of the year. Oh, also this would be an appropriate time for a weather report. It was a great day, totally sunny, comfortable humidity level, very acceptable pollen count, temperatures in the 60's and very little breeze so it felt really warm outside. Please check your Hamfest Weather Almanac for next year's prediction.

Because the kitchen was not finished at Saber Lanes, we also had to manage the food sales ourselves. We did not realize the soda situation was going to be such a problem, but Al KB9BYQ made a run to the grocery store and that got fixed up pretty well. We should have had some de-caf coffee but overall the food situation went pretty well and became a profit item for us this year.

The PA system problem really made us look pretty inept for a while there. That was the biggest problem and more than likely hurt food sales and raffle ticket sales. Pat K9IK did a good job anyway and after we got something working he got things rolling well and the pace of food and raffle ticket sales picked up. That potential problem should always be prepared for from now on. The other big problem was not having enough "door guards." It should be figured out in advance what doors will need guards, and then a schedule and sign up sheet with volunteers prepared.

Because we are getting more people and because I think the crowd we are attracting is becoming more diverse we will have to keep evolving the Hamfest operation and rules. For example -- outside vendors, weather permitting, are now officially placed and charged. We need to officially set an ending time. People showed up as late as 3 p.m. We need a policy about at what age kids are free. A family showed up with, as I recall, kids 13, 10 and 8. It was already about 10:30 so I just charged the parents.

Well, it was fun. The prizes were great. We gave away a Kenwood mobile mount 2m/440 transceiver and a Icom mobile mount 2 meter rig for the grand prizes. Other prizes included some antennas, speakers, coax stuff, a swr meter, some tee-shirts, books and other stuff. The club paid for over half the prizes. It was great to have the County EC van there; they worked the call in a lot which was helpful. People working it came in to ask questions a number of times. It was nice ARRL was represented again by Don, W9IXG. A suggested theme for next year is "Satellite Communications" with maybe a seminar running about doing it as well as some other events. Suggestions are needed.

I will have the web page updated perhaps by the time you get this newsletter. Things are already in good shape for next year for whoever runs the event. The date is set as November 3 and Saber Lanes is booked for now. I appreciated the opportunity to run the event this year. Thanks a lot.

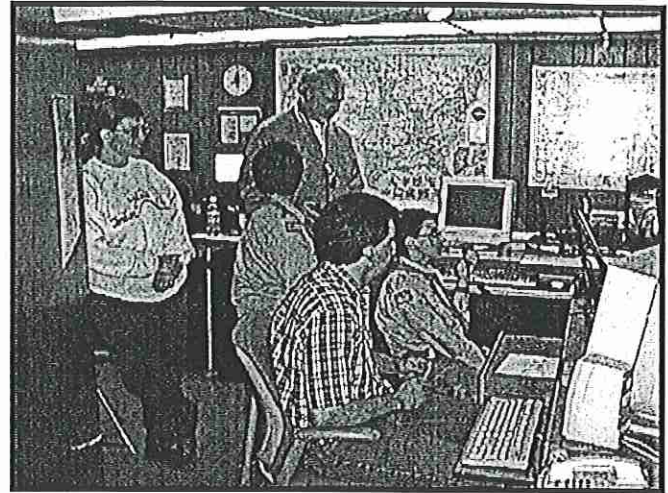
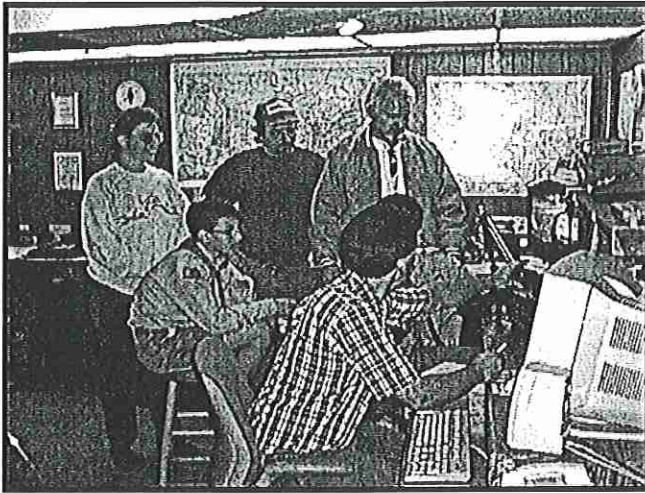

EC Resources Mobile Communications Center (MCC)

In May 2000, John Morack, N9ZXR, donated a 25-foot travel trailer to EC Resources. This trailer was intended to be converted to a mobile communications center (MCC) for ARES and RACES activities. ECR researched many alternatives for a couple years before deciding upon a travel trailer.

When the trailer became available, John took possession and cordially donated it to ECR.

The first year of ownership was the design stage. Between ECR Board Members, Mark Heimmermann, KF9CS, Jeff Schmeichel, KB9BYP, and Steve Schmeichel, N9LDD, and me, we all provided input from our operations experience and seeing other similar units. Once a design was complete, the work began. Fortunately, Jeff and Steve, were dedicated enough to gut the unit, and install all new materials, electrical wiring, coaxial cable, walls, flooring, carpeting, counter tops, antennas and supports and all electronic equipment. Martha Schmeichel, N9JAD, helped Steve and Jeff a great deal and also made the unit more friendly and inviting by making new curtains. As a result, the MCC is an excellent unit, and I personally thank John for donating the trailer, and Steve, Jeff and Martha for creating an excellent mobile operating environment. Others donated items and equipment as well. The MCC has an unbelievable amount of capabilities, and after we install the communications equipment, and the remainder of the emergency power equipment, it will be ready to operate in any environment indefinitely.

ECR is now in the donation stage. The list of equipment we are attempting to acquire from manufacturers includes:
