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
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·2006 FCARC Elections

·Hams in the Fox Valley

I still consider my self a new Ham since I've only been licensed for about two years now. I will say that the other Amateurs in this area are very open to new Hams and will often help them out in any way that they can.

Sure Rick probably could have found something else to spend his time on but instead he choose to help John troubleshoot the issues.

Once again I thank everybody in the Fox Valley for their support of the new and old Hams.

·SSB on 2 Meters?

Back in February I purchased an IC-706MKIIG, basically because I wanted to have a radio for 6 meters and have a radio for HF when I upgrade my license to General. I also wanted to try out SSB on 2 meters. I enjoyed talking to everyone on 2 meters FM but I now wanted to try and get my signal out a little further using simplex. I knew that using SSB my signal would be able to get out further than if I were to use FM.

So knowing this and being eager to test it out I tried to call CQ on 144.200 USB. At first I was discouraged but I kept calling CQ for about a half hour, waiting about a minute or two between each call. Finally at 03:39 UTC, 9:39pm local time, I got a call back from KC9AOD in Chilton. It wasn't a very far contact but at least I made a contact using SSB on 2 meters. Our contact went on until 03:54 UTC, 9:54 PM local.

A couple of days later KG8RF e-mailed me about setting up a time to meet on SSB as well. On Saturday at 03:00 UTC Eric and my self met on 144.200 USB and eventually moved up to 144.210 USB, just to get off of the calling frequency. This contact was actually a little harder to make. With my self being new on SSB I didn't know much about the settings you have to adjust when using SSB. Eric's signal was there but it was very hard to understand. Just as I remembered that I should use the Shift knob on my radio Eric adjusted his transmit frequency up a little bit and that fixed it. When we went up to 144.210 he left it right on frequency and I tried to adjust it with the Shift knob. It made it so his signal was easy to hear and understand. This contact went on for almost 40 minutes, yet it only felt like 5.

So far SSB on 2 meters has been a fun experience. For both of these contacts I was only running 10 watts into my vertical dual band 2m/440 antenna which has 6db gain on 2 meters. The thing is that when using SSB your antenna polarization is supposed to be horizontal, not vertical. From what I've read if your antenna is vertical and other stations is horizontal there is about 20db loss in signal strength. I figured I'd give it a shot anyways because you never know if you don't try. I encourage others who have the equipment to use 2 meter SSB to give it a shot. I'm sure you won't regret it.
