Neue Liebe zum Vaterland

Had it really been 7 years since I last visited Germany? It seems like only yesterday that I would visit once or twice per year. Could I remember the words..."*Deutschland, Deutschland über Alles.*" A lot has changed since my last visit. My father (my namesake and the one with German roots) had passed during this time; my mother had also passed a few years later. Dad would use the Henkle knives to carve the turkey at Thanksgiving and Mom used to ask to look at the pictures from my trips and I was sure to send her a postcard from my visits abroad. The Deutschmark is no longer in use, now it's the Euro. What else has changed? Does the autobahn still have unlimited speed? Do they still drink bier?

Since my last visit - our children have grown, with the two oldest having studied German in High School and both having been to Europe. They still *sprache Deutsch* on occasion. We had hosted a German exchange student at our home in Neenah. Konstantin taught me some German; however he wanted to practice his English most the time. Konstantin was also fascinated with being able to check out books from the Neenah library. He's since been back to visit and recently completed his junior year of college while attending UW-Eau Claire.



I was going to München for business, but I wanted to find a way to mix some *amateurfunk* into my trip. Prior to the trip, I had contacted a local Munich radio club. During our exchange of emails, it was suggested that I bring a 2m HT, as they use 2m for local talk around. They do not have many repeaters; however there are many known simplex frequencies that they use. We agreed on a frequency and a time to make contact, as their tradefair buildings (*Messe München*) were not too far from Georg's (DL5NO) home. I was advised to throw a "DL /" in front of my call, as that would satisfy the reciprocal agreement rules. Now with all the airport rules, could I take an HT with me? I contacted the airline and the TSA to enquire if I could bring a transceiver on board. Both indicated that this is not a good idea; however I could pack one in my checked luggage. I ended up packing an HT in my luggage, however without the battery pack. I remembered that the airlines do not like lithium batteries in the cargo area, so I carried this in my carry on bag. I also placed several copies of my FCC license in my suitcase, just in case. I am happy to report that the HT made it there and back without problems.

Later in the week, I was able to attend a monthly meeting of the München-Nord radio club. It was held at the restaurant Dietrich von Bern. This gave me a chance to try out a new U-Bahn line (underground subway). I had been walking and using the super public transportation system of Munich all week. I could get used to this, you can go anywhere without a car! As the meeting was at a restaurant, everyone had ordered a meal and a bier (or two), so I jumped right in. The club's Director, Hans (DK3YD) welcomed me to the meeting. The meeting format was both formal and informal; in that they conducted club business, discussed upcoming events and had a tech-



nical presentation on digital (broadcast) radio from one of the members who is an engineer for BMW. It was also at this meeting where Hans presented the DARC (Deutscher Amateur-Radio-Club) cup to the club for taking 2nd place in a German wide CW contest. The members of the club made me feel right at home, as I had a chance to talk with all of them. Though the meeting was conducted *auf Deutsch*, Hans paused at each topic and translated to English for my benefit. We discussed the topics found in the latest *QST*, as well as the US Field Day coming up in June and the two German Field Day events for 2008. In Germany, they have a CW Field Day and a SSB Field Day. However, the members present this evening were all looking forward to the US Field Day, as the majority planned to participate.

I did bring a couple of *Green Bay Packers* hats as gifts and presented them to Hans, for himself or for a club raffle. We all had a good laugh over the difference between American football and real fußball! All in the room rooted for *Bayern München*, and for the German national team. In exchange for the Packer wear, the members all signed a *München 850 Jahre* Special Event (celebrating Munich's 850 year anniversary since becoming a city) QSL card and presented it to me. I enjoyed my visit to the radio club meeting and very much look forward to finding a way back to the fatherland.

2008 FIELD DAY WRAP-UP

Field Day 2008 is in the books!

Quantitatively, it was a success. We scored 792 QSO's (498 CW, 248 Phone, 46 digital) which is better than the 704 we had last year. Our total score with bonus points should be pretty close to last year's. So a tip of the capacity hat to all the operators and to everyone who showed up for the event. To try to name all the names would be to probably forget someone, but special thanks go out to:

- Karen WB9ZNA and the food crew, for keeping our bodies going over the 24 hour operating period
- Erick KB9TLM for providing transportation for the batteries and the trailer accessories
- Vern N9RQM and his crew who brought out and took back the Long Van trailer

Other miscellaneous notes, in no particular order:

• A brief hailstorm Saturday afternoon sent everyone but the CW crew scurrying for cover and caused a brief halt in the phone operations.

• Operators reported that they were really working for their Q's because of the crowded band conditions.

• We had 48 entries in our guest log, including State Sen. Robert Cowles and Neenah Alderman Nick Piergrossi. Nick even helped with set-up!

• After hanging out on 6 meters without success all day, the "magic band" opened up to the east coast Sunday morning just before contest's end and we were working them as fast as we could log them. This was on a homebrew dipole conjured up on the spot by Gregg W9IEI, Frank N9LT, and Andy KC9IZF.

• The night phone crew managed to log Hawaii on 80 meters early Sunday morning. Overall, the newly constructed (by Tony AB9IO) twin-lead-fed dipole seemed to work pretty well.

• One of our guests was Patty KN2F from the Green Bay Mike & Key Club, who dropped in on her bicycle (!) and stuck around for several hours working CW.

• We managed to keep both HF stations manned for the entire contest this year.

All told, it was a great experience, with lots of hands-on radio and good times had by all. Keep the last weekend in June open for next year – it's going to be GREAT. Check out the photo gallery on this site under Field Day 2008 for some photos of the action.
