#### Planes, radio make event station special

Put together Ham radio, thousands upon thousands of aircraft and free food and you have one of an amateur's favorite spots, a special event station at the annual Experimental Aircraft Association (EAA) AirVenture in Oshkosh.

AirVenture's special event station ran from Wednesday, July 27- Sunday, July 31. It included operators beyond the sponsoring Fox Cities Amateur Radio Club so Hams from across the country were at the mics including Bob Seaquist, KC9IWE.

AirVenture, often referred to as the "EAA Fly-In," dates back to 1953 and has become The World's Greatest Aviation Celebration. More than half a million people show up at Wittman Field in Oshkosh for the week. Hundreds of volunteers are there even longer helping with the set-up and tear down.

One of the participating Hams, John Smith, KC9FMC, of Milwaukee, is an old hand at Oshkosh. He arrives a full week before the event to volunteer directing traffic. He camps in a trailer and is one of thousands of campers who live in long, long rows of tents mingled among the multi-million dollar diesel powered bus campers.

AirVenture is not a place for those who suffer sticker-shock easily. It seems like nothing is cheap ranging from a \$4 ice cream cone (Chocolate Shoppe Zanzibar Chocolate) to a multi-million dollar executive jet. For those on a budget there's the American Champion Aircraft "Champ," a small two place aircraft which is a 1930s era design. It starts at \$116,000.

Oshkosh does not discriminate between the well-clad, neatly shorn hoi poloi and real people. They stand side-by-side on the flight line watching the daily air show or simply watching the endless parade and variety of planes taking off and landing.

Oshkosh is a number of superlatives starting with being, by far, the busiest airport in the world during AirVenture week. Large teams of FAA flight controllers manage a parade of craft that includes flimsy, exposed frame home builts followed by multi-engine jet warplanes.

More than 10,000 aircraft come and go during the week. That includes antique warbirds, home builts, exotics such as the Concorde, business craft and more. It's not unusual to see several acres of the vee-tailed Beechcraft Bonanzas or similar planes. As a result, the physical area is huge and impossible to fully see unless visitors are willing to spend an entire week.

That's not to say a one day visit isn't valuable. Starting at 10 a.m. a person can see many of the major manufacturer's exhibits, ride a tram to see some of the many parked planes and still take in the afternoon air show.

The FCARC special event station was part of KidVenture, an entire area where kids can learn and explore aviation and technology. Children can make a composite wing, form a wing's rib, rivet materials and fly model helicopters. The special event station is set up in a small shed formerly the communications building at the Lone Rock, Wis., airport. The original radio panels and teletype machines are there too. FCARC operates two HF stations, a 6 meter station and a 2 meter repeater using the club call, W9ZL. Like many special event stations, operation is pretty casual and interested passersby are invited to make a few QSOs. Among them was 13 year old Dalton, a Michigan boy who quickly caught on. He also had many good questions about how amateur radio works.

There were glitches. The EAA volunteer assigned to unlock the buildings and hangers in the KidVenture area was not reliable so the station was late getting on. And then a Brooklyn, NY youth music group was assigned to perform just a few feet from the station, also making it impossible to operate.
